The DCEC Special Recognition Awards:



1. Presenting the strategic road map and objectives...


In **March of 2019**, the Druze Council Eghtirab Affairs Committee (DCEC) presented its strategic objectives, and the related multi- track five-year plan and roadmap.

The plan multiple tracks focused on thee primary areas: Communications, Events, and Druze Community social development initiatives.

All three tracks were worked on concurrently. Communications databases were obtained, as well as two key events were worked on for the initial period of 2019 and 2020. The **Joint Annual Social Affairs Committee Dinner** at the Phoenicia Hotel, and the preparation of the **2020 International Conference** in Lebanon.

Initial drafts of the 2020 conference program were developed to cover all key topics of concern, as well and to provide a platform for the Community Social Development Projects.






2. Creating Communication Products...






